About Our Church

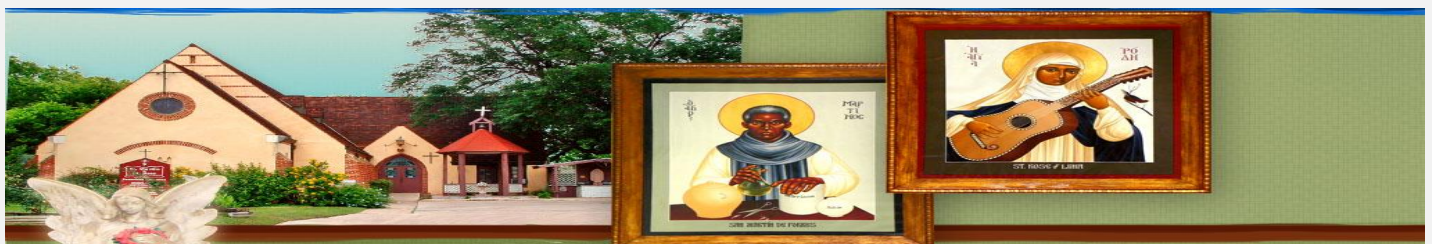

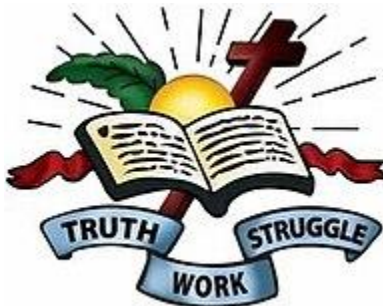

Instructions:

1. **Open the iBreviary app:** Launch the iBreviary app on your mobile device.
2. **Navigate to the "Download" section:** Find the "Download" option within the app's menu.
3. **Select the date:** Choose the date you want to download the texts.
4. **Choose your language:** Select the language you want the text displayed.
5. **Initiate download:** Click the "Download" button to download the liturgical texts for the selected day.
6. *** The Readings are located by tapping on the “Pray” tab, then tap the “Readings” tab for the readings for the mass.***



Reflection

The calling of Peter, a fisherman, to become a fisher of men is the call of vocation. Vocation comes from the Latin root “vocare,” which means “to call.” Each one of us is called to serve the Lord by our gifts. As Jesus suggests to Peter, “Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch,” Notice how Jesus doesn’t command or force Peter to do this. In fact, Peter contradicts Jesus’s suggestion by retorting, “Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing...” In the end, Peter hopelessly follows Jesus’s recommendation, receives many fish, and learns humility and trust in the Lord. Peter falls to his knees and recognizes that not only is he a sinner, but that he has much to learn from Jesus. Through humility, he surrenders it all to follow Jesus, who then calls him, “Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men.” Like Peter, it is not enough to recognize our sinfulness; we must strive to humble ourselves, surrender our entirety to Jesus, and trust in his call. Whether we are called to marriage, clergy, ministries of the parish, or community, whatever we do, we should do it for the glory of God and hear the vocation he is calling us to serve. Reflect on these questions this week:

- What is my vocation?
 - Am I living out my vocation to the fullest?
- What gifts do I bring to my ministry?
 - What ministries do I feel called to serve?
- How do I help others find their vocations?
 - Do I prevent others from answering their vocation or hinder them from hearing the call?

As we continue through the week to listen to the Lord’s call, let us continue to help one another build up the kingdom of God by assisting the ministry of St. Peter in becoming fishers of men. Let us go in peace, glorifying the lord by our lives.

About The Polish National Catholic Church (PNCC)

- The Polish National Catholic Church(PNCC) adopted a “Joint Declaration on Unity” with the Roman Catholic Church through which both bodies agreed to a limited communion arrangement.
 - We are in Dialogue with the Roman Catholic Church
 - The Polish National Catholic Church(PNCC) permits **divorced people** to participate fully in the Mass and to receive the Eucharist. The church does not recognize civil divorce and requires an annulment before parishioners can remarry.
 - The Polish National Catholic Church(PNCC) is governed by its Constitution and Laws. The legislative authority of the Church is vested in the General Synod, the Special Synod, the Diocesan Synod, and the Parish Meeting. In financial and administrative matters, the Parishioners possess administrative authority. Representatives elected at the Annual Parish Meeting and confirmed by the Diocesan Bishop exercise their constitutional authority.
 - The hierarchy is as follows:
 - Prime Bishop: Rt. Rev. Anthony Mikovsky
 - Diocesan Bishop of the Buffalo-Pittsburgh Diocese: Rt. Rev. John E. Mack

 - The Polish National Catholic Church (PNCC) is not under the authority of the Pope (Bishop) of Rome.
 - The Polish National Catholic Church (PNCC) observes the seven sacraments, and they are as follows:
 - 1. Baptism and Confirmation
 - 2. The Word of God
 - 3. Penance
 - 4. Eucharist
 - 5. Holy Unction (Anointing for Health)
 - 6. Holy Orders
 - 7. Matrimony
 - All Polish National Catholic Church (PNCC) sacraments are valid and licit.
 - The Polish National Catholic Church (PNCC) clergy are permitted to marry.
